THS110 Christian Faith: Understanding and Application (3 course hours)

The Christian faith is built upon the interpretation of content found in the Old and New Testaments of the Bible. In this course we will examine basic affirmations of faith that Christians have developed in relation to certain biblical texts. Understandings related to the identity of God, the nature of humanity, the created world around us, and God's interactions with humanity will be topics of conversation. As we discuss each topic we will also consider the lives we live day to day and seek to discover how faith impacts the ways we think, speak, and act.

THS210 Christianity in Conversation (3 course hours)

Religion has a central place in the development and expression of human culture. Christians have not always been conscious of the similarities and differences between various religions nor how to share meaningful conversations with people of other religions (or none). Christianity in Conversation will highlight the role of religion in the United States. An approach to understanding the beliefs and practices of several world religions will be pursued, in conjunction with developing primary Christian theological assertions.
